5.W.10 - Write routinely over extended time frames (time for research, reflection, and revision) and shorter time frames (a single sitting or a day or two) for a range of discipline-specific tasks, purposes, and audiences.

Cues	Notes
What is the writing process?	The writing process includes drafting, revising, and editing.
Why is revision important?	Revision helps improve the quality of writing through multiple drafts.
How does audience affect writing?	Writing style and tone should change based on the audience and purpose. Examples include journaling, research reports, and letters.
What are some real-world writing tasks?	Examples include journames, research reports, und letters.
