What is the standard?	The standard involves introducing a topic clearly, providing a general observation and focus, and grouping related information logically.
Why is it important? What are common misconceptions?	It is important because it helps students learn to organize and present information effectively, which is a critical skill in both academic and real-world contexts.
How can we use multimedia? How do we organize information?	Common misconceptions include thinking illustrations are just for decoration and believing all related information should be in one paragraph. Multimedia can enhance understanding by providing visual context and
	clarification. Information should be organized using headings and subheadings to make it easier to follow.
