| What is a primary source? | Primary sources are original documents or firsthand accounts. |
| What is a secondary source? | Secondary sources interpret or analyze primary sources. |
| How do you determine the central idea? | To determine the central idea, identify the main points the author is making. |
| What is the difference between a summary and an opinion? | A summary is an objective recount of the main ideas, while an opinion includes personal thoughts. |
| Why is summarization important? | Summarization helps in understanding and retaining key information from texts. |
