What is visual information?	Visual information includes charts, graphs, photographs, videos, and maps.
Why is it important to integrate visual and textual information?	Integrating visual and textual information provides a more comprehensive understanding of a topic.
How can visual information be misleading?	Visual information can be misleading if taken out of context or if the source is biased.
What are some examples of visual information?	Examples include historical maps, statistical graphs, documentary videos, and photographs from significant events.
