What is a fact?	A fact is a statement that can be proven true or false.
What is an opinion?	An opinion is a statement that reflects personal beliefs or feelings.
What is a reasoned judgment?	A reasoned judgment is a conclusion based on evidence and logical reasoning.
Why is it important to distinguish among them?	Distinguishing among these helps us critically evaluate information and form well-supported arguments.
How can we apply this skill?	This skill is useful in analyzing news, historical documents, and forming arguments.
