What is text structure?	Text structure refers to how information is organized in a text.
Why is text structure important?	Understanding text structure helps in comprehending the text better.
How do major sections contribute to the whole?	Each section of a text serves a purpose and contributes to the overall understanding.
Examples of different text structures	Examples include cause/effect, problem/solution, and chronological order.
Common misconceptions about text structure	Misconceptions include thinking all texts have the same structure and that structure is only about paragraph order.
