| How to identify strong evidence? | Strong evidence: Relevant, directly supports the claim. |
| Difference between opinion and evidence? | Opinion vs. Evidence: Opinion is personal belief, evidence is text-based. |
| Why is textual evidence important? | Importance: Enhances credibility, supports arguments. |
| Examples of using evidence in writing? | Examples: Research papers, lab reports, historical analysis. |
