What is evidence?	Evidence: Information from the text that supports analysis.
How to identify strong evidence?	Strong evidence: Relevant, directly supports the claim.
Difference between opinion and	Opinion vs. Evidence: Opinion is personal belief, evidence is text-based.
evidence?	Importance: Enhances credibility, supports arguments.
Why is textual evidence important?	Examples: Research papers, lab reports, historical analysis.
