What are intensive pronouns?	Intensive pronouns add emphasis to a subject or antecedent.
How are intensive pronouns used?	They are used to highlight or stress the noun they refer to.
What is the difference between intensive and reflexive	Intensive pronouns can be removed without changing the sentence's meaning, unlike reflexive pronouns.
pronouns?	Correct use of intensive pronouns enhances writing and speaking by adding emphasis where needed.
Why is it important to use intensive pronouns correctly?	Examples: myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, yourselves, themselves.
