Figures of Speech	Figures of speech are expressions that convey meanings beyond the literal words.
Personification	
Litaralya Figuratiya	Personification gives human traits to non-human objects.
Literal vs. Figurative	Literal language means exactly what it says; figurative language uses
Examples	creative expressions.
Impact on Meaning	Examples: 'The wind whispered through the trees' (personification).
	Figurative language enhances storytelling by creating vivid imagery and conveying complex ideas.
