What is textual evidence?	Textual evidence includes quotes or paraphrases from the text that support an analysis.
How to cite textual evidence?	Citing evidence involves quoting the text and explaining its relevance.
What is an inference?	An inference is a conclusion drawn from evidence and reasoning.
How to support inferences with evidence?	Supporting inferences requires linking them back to specific evidence in the text.
Why is textual evidence important?	Textual evidence is crucial for validating interpretations and arguments.
