Writing Effective Conclusions

Notes
A conclusion is the final part of a piece of writing that summarizes the main points and provides closure.
A conclusion is important because it ties together the entire argument
and leaves a lasting impression on the reader.
A conclusion can add value by providing a final insight, call to action, or a
thought-provoking statement that enhances the argument.
Common misconceptions include thinking that a conclusion is just a restatement of the introduction or that it is unnecessary if the body is
strong.
An effective conclusion summarizes the main points, provides a final insight or call to action, and leaves a lasting impression.
