What is a conclusion?	A conclusion provides closure and summarizes the main points.
Why is a conclusion important?	It reinforces the main ideas and leaves a lasting impression.

Common mistakes in writing conclusions	Common mistakes include only summarizing or thinking it's unnecessary.
Examples of strong conclusions	Strong conclusions connect back to the introduction and provide a sense of completeness.
