What is narrative writing?	Narrative writing involves telling a story with a clear sequence of events.
Why are descriptive details important?	Descriptive details help to create vivid images in the reader's mind and make the story more engaging.
How can real experiences be included in narratives?	Real experiences can be blended with fictional elements to create richer narratives.
What are common misconceptions about narrative writing?	Common misconceptions include thinking narratives must be fictional and that details are not important.
What skills will students develop?	Students will learn to write structured and detailed narratives, and develop advanced writing techniques.
