Cues	Notes
What is source credibility?	Source credibility refers to the trustworthiness of the information.
How do you avoid plagiarism?	To avoid plagiarism, always credit the original source, even when paraphrasing.
What is a bibliography?	A bibliography is a list of sources used in research.
Why is it important to cite sources?	Citing sources gives credit to authors and avoids plagiarism.
How can you evaluate a source?	Evaluate a source by checking the author's credentials, publication date, and cross-referencing with other reliable sources.
