What is the standard 6.W.9a?	Standard 6.W.9a involves applying grade 6 reading standards to literature by comparing and contrasting texts in different forms or genres.
How do you compare and	
contrast texts?	To compare and contrast texts, identify both similarities and differences. Use tools like Venn diagrams for visual aid.
What are common	
misconceptions?	Common misconceptions include thinking comparison is only about differences and believing themes are always explicitly stated.
What is a theme?	, , ,
	A theme is the underlying message or main idea of a text.
How do you identify themes in	
texts?	Themes can be identified by examining characters' actions, settings, and plot developments.

Summary
