Cues	Notes
What are Greek and Latin roots?	Greek and Latin roots are the base parts of words from which many English words are derived.
Why are roots important?	Roots help in understanding the meaning of new words by providing a clue to their definitions.
How can roots help in	
understanding new words?	By knowing common roots, students can decode unfamiliar words and expand their vocabulary.
Examples of common Greek and	
Latin roots	Examples: 'bell' means war (belligerent, bellicose), 'aqua' means water (aquarium, aquatic).
Common misconceptions about	
roots	Misconception: All words with the same root have the same meaning. Reality: Context and additional word parts influence meaning.
