Figures of Speech	Figures of speech are expressions that convey meanings beyond the literal words used.
Literal vs. Figurative	Literal language means exactly what it says; figurative language uses
Allusions	creative expressions.
Idioms	Allusions are indirect references to literary, biblical, or mythological works.
Metaphors	Idioms are common phrases with meanings different from their literal interpretation.
	Metaphors compare two unlike things without using 'like' or 'as'.
