What are interactions in a text?	Interactions in a text refer to how individuals, events, and ideas influence one another.
How do individuals influence events?	Individuals can shape events through their actions, decisions, and perspectives.
What are implicit connections?	Implicit connections are relationships that are not directly stated but can be inferred from the text.
Why are indirect influences important?	Indirect influences, though not immediately obvious, can significantly affect the understanding and interpretation of a text.
How can graphic organizers help?	Graphic organizers help visually map out relationships and interactions, aiding in the identification of both explicit and implicit connections.
