Cues	Notes
What is the main idea?	The main idea is the central point the author wants to convey.
How do authors present information differently?	Authors present information differently by emphasizing various evidence and interpretations.
What is evidence?	Evidence is the information that supports the author's main idea or argument.
What are interpretations? Why is it important to compare	Interpretations are the ways in which authors explain or understand evidence.
authors?	Comparing authors helps us understand multiple perspectives and develop critical thinking.
