Soliloquy	A soliloquy is a speech given by a character alone on stage, revealing their inner thoughts.
Sonnet	A sonnet is a 14-line poem with a specific rhyme scheme and meter, often
Stanza	exploring themes of love and nature.
Form	A stanza is a grouped set of lines in a poem, often separated by a blank line, that functions like a paragraph in prose.
Structure	Form refers to the overall structure or shape of a literary work, including
Meaning	its genre and specific structural elements.
	Structure refers to the arrangement of and relationships between the parts of a text.
