What is historical fiction?	Historical fiction blends historical facts with imaginative storytelling.

Why compare fiction with historical accounts?	Comparing helps understand the author's creative choices and historical context.
What are common misconceptions about historical	Misconception: Historical fiction is always accurate.
fiction?	Misconception: Historical accounts are always objective.
How to evaluate historical sources?	Evaluate sources by considering the author's perspective and potential biases.
