Why is evaluating arguments	
important?	Evaluating arguments helps develop critical thinking and informed decision-making skills.
What are common misconceptions?	Misconception: Any evidence can support a claim. Misconception: Confidence equals validity.
How can we identify relevant	
evidence?	Relevant evidence directly supports the claim and is logically connected.
What is a logical fallacy?	A logical fallacy is a flaw in reasoning that weakens an argument.
