Punctuation for Pauses and Breaks

Today's Standard

8.L.2a - Use punctuation (comma, ellipsis, dash) to indicate a pause or break.

Cues	Notes
Comma	Commas are used to separate items in a list, clauses, or to indicate a slight pause.
Ellipsis	Ellipses are used to show omitted material or a trailing off of thought.
Dash	Dack as an areata areakasis indicata an abrumt abanca areat off
Pause	Dashes can create emphasis, indicate an abrupt change, or set off additional information.
Break	Each punctuation mark serves a unique purpose and is not interchangeable.
Punctuation usage	Overuse of punctuation can make writing confusing.
