What is an ellipsis?	An ellipsis is a series of three dots () used to indicate omitted text.
When should you use an ellipsis?	Use an ellipsis to shorten quotes or show trailing thoughts in dialogue.
	An ellipsis always consists of three dots.
How many dots are in an ellipsis?	Common misconceptions: Ellipses can be used anywhere; Ellipses have more than three dots.
What are common	
misconceptions about ellipses?	Ellipses help condense information while preserving the original meaning.
