What are affixes?	Affixes are prefixes or suffixes added to a root word to change its meaning.
What are roots?	
	Roots are the basic part of a word that carries the main meaning.
Why are Greek and Latin roots	
important?	Greek and Latin roots are important because many English words are derived from these languages.
How can roots help in understanding words?	Knowing roots can help decode the meaning of unfamiliar words.
Examples of Greek and Latin roots	Examples: 'pre' (before), 'cede' (go), 're' (again)
