Cues	Notes
What is point of view?	Point of view refers to the perspective from which a story is told.
What is dramatic irony?	Dramatic irony occurs when the audience knows something that the characters do not.
How does point of view affect a story?	Different points of view can create effects like suspense or humor.
Examples of suspense in literature	Suspense is often created when the audience knows something that the characters do not.
Examples of humor in literature	Humor can arise from characters' misunderstandings or dramatic irony.
