What is 8.RL.9?	8.RL.9 involves analyzing how modern fiction draws on themes, events, and characters from traditional stories.
Examples of modern works influenced by traditional stories	Examples include 'The Lion King' and 'Hamlet', 'Percy Jackson' and Greek mythology, 'The Matrix' and biblical references.
Common misconceptions about literary influence	Misconception 1: Modern works copy traditional stories without changes. Misconception 2: Only ancient stories influence modern literature.
