Cues	Notes
Key terms	Delineate: To describe or portray something precisely.
What is the standard?	Evaluate: To judge or determine the significance, worth, or quality of something.
Why is evaluating arguments important?	Sound reasoning: Logical and well-founded arguments.
How to identify irrelevant evidence?	Relevance: The quality of being directly connected with and important to something else.
	Irrelevant evidence: Information that does not support the main argument or claim.
