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| What is formal language? | Formal language is structured, follows grammar rules, and is used in professional or serious situations. |
| When should you use formal language? | Use formal language in presentations, interviews, and when speaking to authority figures. |
| How do you adapt speech to different contexts? | Adapting speech involves changing tone, style, and delivery based on the audience and context. |
| Examples of adapting speech. | Examples: Formal presentation vs. casual conversation with friends. |
