Cues	Notes
What is formal language?	Formal language is structured, follows grammar rules, and is used in professional or serious situations.
When should you use formal language?	Use formal language in presentations, interviews, and when speaking to authority figures.
How do you adapt speech to different contexts?	Adapting speech involves changing tone, style, and delivery based on the audience and context.
Examples of adapting speech.	Examples: Formal presentation vs. casual conversation with friends.
