What is logical reasoning?	Logical reasoning involves using sound judgment to connect evidence to a claim.
How do you evaluate a source's	
credibility?	Evaluate a source by looking at the author's credentials, publication date, and purpose.
Why is relevant evidence	
important?	Relevant evidence directly supports the claim and makes the argument stronger.
What are common	
misconceptions about evidence?	Common misconceptions include using any source and thinking more evidence is always better.
How can you improve your argument?	Improve your argument by selecting credible, relevant evidence and connecting it logically to your claim.
