What is informative writing?	Informative writing aims to educate the reader on a specific topic using facts and evidence.
Why is organization important?	
	A clear structure helps the reader follow and understand the information
How to distinguish between fact and opinion?	presented.
	Facts are statements that can be proven true, while opinions are personal
What are common structures for informative texts?	beliefs or judgments.
	Common structures include introduction, body paragraphs, and conclusion.
