| Cues | Notes |
|--------------|--|
| Credibility | Credibility: Check author's credentials, publication date, and domain. |
| Paraphrasing | Paraphrasing: Restate information in your own words but still requires citation. |
| Plagiarism | Plagiarism: Using someone else's work without giving credit. |
| Citation | Citation: Properly crediting sources to avoid plagiarism. |
| Search Terms | Search Terms: Use specific and relevant keywords to find accurate |
