Cues	Notes
Point of View	Point of View: The perspective from which a story or text is told.
Author's Purpose	Author's Purpose: The reason an author writes, such as to inform, entertain, or persuade.
Main Idea	Main Idea. The control the use to a manager of a tout
Supporting Details	Main Idea: The central thought or message of a text.
Bias	Supporting Details: Evidence and examples that support the main idea.
Dias	Bias: A tendency to present information in a way that reflects a particular viewpoint.

Understanding how different authors approach the same topic helps develop critical thinking and analytical skills. By comparing points of view, students learn to identify biases and evaluate the credibility of sources.
