| Cues             | Notes  |
|------------------|--|
| Primary source   | Primary sources are original materials from the time period being studied.   |
| Secondary source | Secondary sources are interpretations or analyses based on primary sources.  |
| Bias             | Bias refers to a particular preference or point of view that is personal,  |
| Perspective      | rather than scientific.  |
| Reliability      | Perspective is the position from which something is considered or evaluated.   |
|                  | Reliability is the trustworthiness of a source, which can depend on the author's credentials, purpose, and evidence. |
