Cues	Notes
Primary source	Primary sources are original materials from the time period being studied.
Secondary source	Secondary sources are interpretations or analyses based on primary sources.
Bias	Bias refers to a particular preference or point of view that is personal, rather than scientific.
Perspective	Perspective is the position from which something is considered or evaluated.
Reliability	Reliability is the trustworthiness of a source, which can depend on the author's credentials, purpose, and evidence.
