What is textual evidence?	Textual evidence refers to specific details or quotes from a text that support an analysis or argument.
How do you identify strong evidence?	Strong evidence is relevant, specific, and directly supports the point being made.
What is an inference?	An inference is a logical conclusion drawn from the available evidence in the text.
Why is textual evidence important?	Textual evidence is crucial for supporting arguments and ensuring they are credible and well-founded.
How to support inferences?	Inferences should be backed by specific details from the text to be valid.
