| Rhetorical devices     | Rhetorical devices are techniques used to persuade or impact the audience.      |
| Implicit messages      | Implicit messages are not directly stated but can be inferred.                  |
| Analyzing bias         |   |
| Context clues          | Analyzing bias involves looking for evidence of the author's personal opinions. |
|                        | Context clues help in understanding the author's point of view and purpose.     |
