## **Analyzing Word Choice and Tone**

## Today's Standard

Cues	Notes
What is figurative language?	Figurative language includes metaphors, similes, and other non-literal expressions.
How does context affect connotation?	Connotation is influenced by the context in which a word is used.
What is tone?	Tone refers to the author's attitude toward the subject.
How can word choice impact tone?	Word choice can make a text feel formal, informal, positive, or negative.
Examples of analyzing tone	Analyzing tone involves looking at word choice, sentence structure, and context clues.
