What is evidence-based writing?	Evidence-based writing involves using information from texts to support arguments and ideas.
How to evaluate source credibility?	Source credibility can be evaluated by looking at the author's credentials, publication date, and the evidence provided.
Difference between summary and analysis?	Summarizing is restating main points; analyzing examines components and their implications.
What are informational texts?	Informational texts provide factual information and are used for research and learning.
How to integrate multiple sources?	Integrating multiple sources involves combining information from different texts to support a cohesive argument.
