What is informative writing?	Informative writing aims to educate the reader about a topic.
Why is organization important?	Organization helps readers follow and understand the text.
How does one select content?	Content selection involves choosing relevant and accurate information.
What are common misconceptions?	Misconceptions include lack of structure and overuse of complex vocabulary.
How can clarity be improved?	Clarity can be improved by using simple, precise language and peer reviews.
