Cues	Notes
What is the main idea of the standard?	The standard focuses on gathering and evaluating information from multiple sources and citing them correctly.
How do you evaluate the credibility of a source?	Evaluate sources by checking the author's credentials, publication date, and the website's domain.
What is plagiarism?	Plagiarism is using someone else's work or ideas without giving proper credit.
How do you paraphrase	
information?	Paraphrasing involves rephrasing information in your own words while maintaining the original meaning.
Why is citation important?	
	Citation is important to give credit to original authors and avoid plagiarism.
