Counting Objects to 20

Today's Standard

K.CC.B5 - Count to answer 'how many?' questions about as many as 20 things arranged in a line, a rectangular array, or a circle, or as many as 10 things in a scattered configuration; given a number from 1-20, count out that many objects.

Cues	Notes
Counting	Counting objects up to 20 in various arrangements.
Arrangements	Understanding that arrangement does not change the total count.
One-to-one correspondence	Ensuring one-to-one correspondence by touching/moving each object.
Quantity	Recognizing that quantity remains the same regardless of arrangement.
Manipulatives	Using hands-on tools to practice counting and arrangement.

Summary

Students learn to count up to 20 objects in different arrangements, ensuring accurate counting through one-to-one correspondence and understanding that the total number remains constant regardless of arrangement.
