What is a plural noun?	Plural nouns represent more than one of something.
How do you form plural nouns?	Form regular plural nouns by adding 's' or 'es' to the singular form.
Examples of plural nouns	Examples: cat -> cats, box -> boxes
Common mistakes with plurals	Common mistakes include adding 's' to all nouns or confusing plurals with possessives.
