What are early language skills?	Early language skills include recognizing letters, understanding basic words, and participating in simple conversations.
Why are listening skills important?	Listening skills are important as they form the foundation for understanding spoken language and following instructions.
How do letter recognition activities help?	Letter recognition activities help students differentiate letters and begin forming simple words.
What are common misconceptions? How can misconceptions be	Common misconceptions include thinking fluent reading is needed before understanding language concepts, and confusing letter recognition with word comprehension.
addressed?	Misconceptions can be addressed through listening and speaking activities, and differentiating letter recognition from word comprehension.
