What is classifying?	Classifying involves grouping objects based on shared characteristics.
How do we count objects?	Counting objects means determining the number of items in a group.
Why is sorting important?	Sorting helps us organize and make sense of the world around us.
What are common mistakes?	Common mistakes include thinking categories must be equal and confusing sorting with counting.
