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| What is phonemic awareness? | Phonemic awareness is the ability to hear, identify, and manipulate individual sounds in spoken words. |
| How do syllables and phonemes differ? | Syllables are units of sound that can contain multiple phonemes. Phonemes are the smallest units of sound. |
| What are some activities to develop phonemic awareness? | Activities include clapping hands to count syllables, identifying the first sound in a word, blending sounds to make a word, and segmenting words into individual sounds. |
