What is phoneme manipulation?	Phoneme manipulation involves changing individual sounds in words to create new words.
Examples of phoneme substitution?	Examples include changing 'c' in 'cat' to 'h' to make 'hat'.
Why is this skill important?	This skill is important for reading fluency and spelling.
Common misconceptions?	Misconception: Changing a letter always changes the sound.
How to address misconceptions?	Intervention: Use visual aids and sound cards.
