Cues	Notes
What are the five major vowels?	The five major vowels are A, E, I, O, U.
What is the difference between long and short vowel sounds?	Long vowel sounds are the same as the vowel's name, while short vowel sounds are different.
Why is it important to associate vowel sounds with their spellings?	Associating vowel sounds with their spellings helps in reading and spelling words correctly.
What are common misconceptions about vowel sounds?	Students may confuse long and short vowel sounds or think vowels always make the same sound.
How can we practice vowel sounds?	Practice can include sorting games, flashcards, read-alouds, and interactive apps.
